
RAPPORT CREDIT UNION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Rapport Credit Union's Scholarship Program will apply to two types of students: (1) Students who have successfully completed their secondary school studies and will be continuing their education as a full-time student in any curriculum offered by an accredited University or College. (2) Students currently enrolled in an undergraduate curriculum offered by an accredited University or College and will be continuing their studies in Fall of 2021.

Purpose

The Rapport Credit Union scholarship fund provides financial assistance to students in recognition of their contribution to their community.

Eligibility

To be eligible, the student, parent or grandparent of the student, must be a member of Rapport.

The student must be in their last year of high school and will be continuing their studies in any full-time program at a recognized University or College. Also eligible are current students enrolled in any full-time undergraduate program at a recognized University or College.

Value of Award

Eleven scholarships, each valued at Five Hundred dollars (\$500.00) may be awarded.

Selection Procedure

Successful applicants will be chosen by a Selection Committee based: One scholarship per branch and also one staff or board member; applicant can demonstrate community involvement student government, sports, community services, organizations etc.), volunteerism and academics and submits the required essay and supporting documents.

Application Procedure

Each applicant is required to submit:

- Completed application form with account number clearly written on it. If applicant is not a member, the application needs to be signed by the sponsoring parent or grandparent along with their account number.
 - Reference letter: From a secondary or post-secondary school i.e. teacher, coach, professor, TA, etc., or one from a person familiar with the applicant's involvement in community/organizational activities. This person should be unrelated to the applicant.
 - Copy of acceptance letter at a post-secondary institution or confirmation of enrollment in current college/university program in Fall of 2021.
 - Student must answer the following three questions in essay format:
 1. What are your main banking needs?
 2. How can Rapport meet those needs?
 3. What ideas do you have for Rapport to increase membership of your age group?For high school students, you must attach a **500** minimum word essay and for current college/university students, you must attach a **750** minimum word essay.
